Fun Activities for Spelling Practice

ABC order- Write your words in alphabetical order.

<u>Air Write</u>- Write your spelling words in the air using your "magic finger." Have a partner read your words as you write them. OR a parent can air write the words and YOUR job is to read them. For even more fun, take turns.

Rainbow Words - Write your words in three colors.

Backwards Words - Write your words forwards, then backwards.

<u>Silly sentences</u> -Use all your words in ten silly sentences.

<u>Picture words</u> - Draw a picture and write your words in the picture.

<u>Scrambled words</u> -Write your words, then write them again with the letters mixed up. Put your words aside and work with a partner to unscramble them a few days later!

<u>Surround words</u> - Write your words on graph paper and outline in colors.

Ransom words - Write your words by cutting out letters in a newspaper or magazine and glue them on a paper.

<u>Pyramid Words</u> - Write your words adding or subtracting one letter at a time. The result will be a pyramid shape of words.

<u>Words-Within-Words</u> - Write your word and then write at least 2 words made from each.

<u>Good Clean Words</u> -Write your words in shaving cream on a counter or some other surface that can be cleaned safely.

<u>Pasta Words</u> - Write your words by arranging alphabet pasta or Alphabits cereal. Glue on paper or have a parent write that you completed "Pasta Words" as a spelling activity.

Reversed Words - Write your words in ABC order -backwards!

<u>**3D Words**</u> - Use modeling clay rolled thinly to make your words.

<u>Create an Activity</u> - Can you think of a fun way to do your spelling activities? Try it out!

<u>Magazine words</u> - Use an old magazine or newspaper and find your word. Cut it out and glue it on paper.

<u>Cheer Your Words</u> - Pretend you are a cheerleader and call out your words! Sometimes you'll yell, sometimes you'll whisper!

<u>Sound Words</u> - Use a tape recorder and record your words and their spelling. Then listen to your tape, checking to see that you spelled all the words correctly.

<u>Choo-Choo Words</u> - Write the entire list end-to-end as one long word, using different colors of crayon or ink for different words.

Backwriting - Using your finger, draw each letter on a partners' back, having the partner say the word when completed.

<u>Flashwriting</u> - In a darkened room, use a flashlight to draw letters in the air.

Newspaper Words - Search a newspaper page from top to bottom, circling each letter of a word as you find it.

30 Second Words - Write a TV commercial using all the words from your list.

Popsicles - Make words using popsicle sticks.

<u>Secret Agent Words</u> - Number the alphabet from 1 to 26, then convert your words to a number code.
